Summary:

On Wednesday, August 9, 2017, at approximately 1:06 pm, deputies with the Burke County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to Highway 70 and Rhodhiss Road, in reference to a reported breaking and entering in progress. A Sheriff Office detective investigating previous cases in the area was on the scene in less than one minute. Two defendants were located and identified as Kevin Blaine Jenkins and Cody Dean Limbo. During the course of the investigation, Jenkins and Limbo were also linked to the vehicle break-ins reported in the Knob Mountain Road area on August 4th – 6th. Jenkins and Limbo were taken into custody and confined at Burke Catawba District Confinement Facility under \$50,000.00 secure bond each.
