

This program includes a parent and teen component, which advocates mutual respect among family members, parental guidance, and use of a democratic style of parental leadership that facilitates behavioral correction. of the Medicaid 1915(b)/(c) Waiver. Access to Care will ask some questions to help in finding the type of services that match your needs. You will select a provider and Access to Care will help you schedule your first appointment. Pregnant women who are abusing substances and persons

injecting drugs receive priority scheduling.
